Dear Mr. Mills:

In response to the SNIA request for disclosure of Intellectual Property Claims that HP has identified that may be infringed by the Disk Data Format (DDF) v1.2 specification, the following Essential Claims are identified:

- 1. US Patent No. 5,440,716 --- Claims 1-4
- 2. US Patent No. 5,592,648 --- Claim 5
- 3. US Patent No. 5.909,691 --- Claim 6
- 4. US Patent No. 6,505,268 --- Claims 4 and 7

HP is not willing to license these patents in compliance with Sections 3.4 & 3.5 of the Storage Networking Industry Association (SNIA) Intellectual Property Policy, Version 2.0 as approved on August 28, 2003.
